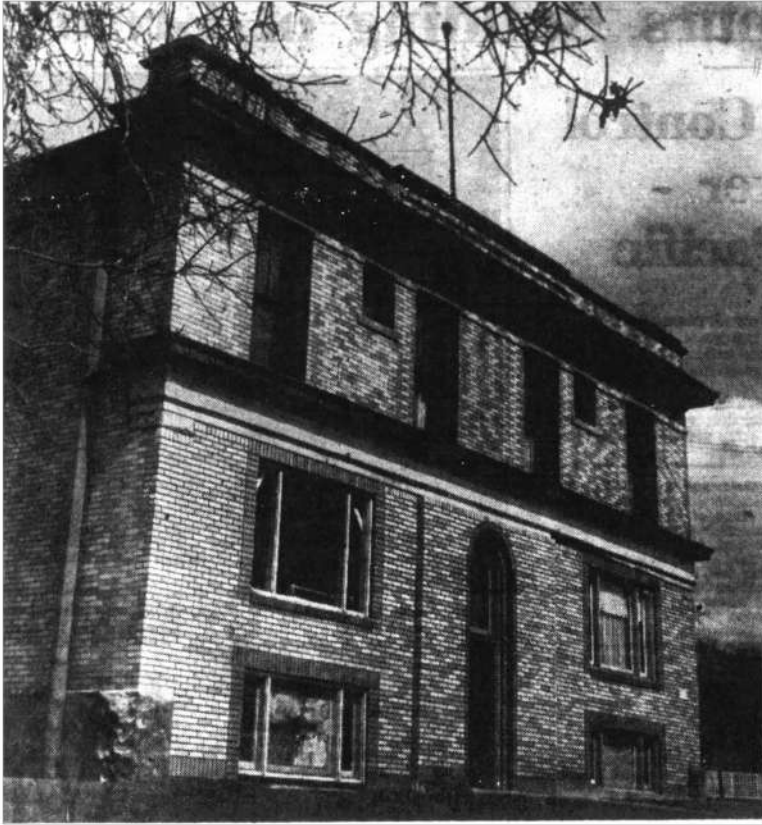


OLD POST OFFICE

Old Post Office Apartments ("OPO") has an incredibly rich history and been a staple in this neighborhood for over 120 years. Even though the property has been fully remodeled, its history and character lives on.

In July 1904, this two-story post office building opened to the public. The top floor contained two apartments for employees while the ground floor contained the post office and a drug store. The adjacent bungalow was built in 1880. The post office was named "Station A" and was the first sub-station of Salt Lake City's main post office.

Station A was closed in 1913, and the building was used for a variety of commercial operations including an ice cream factory and a dry-cleaning service. In 1939, it was converted into an apartment building. Over the years, OPO has undergone several extensive renovations to include modern conveniences such as heated concrete flooring.



In March 1939, the post office was converted into nine 3-room apartments. The large glass storefronts were bricked up, and a new residential entrance made. Today, it's now home to 17 units in total, including the 2 unit bungalow as shown below.

The bungalow located adjacent to Old Post Office was built in 1880. It was originally the home of the Postmaster General.
